Sports have always been in his heart.

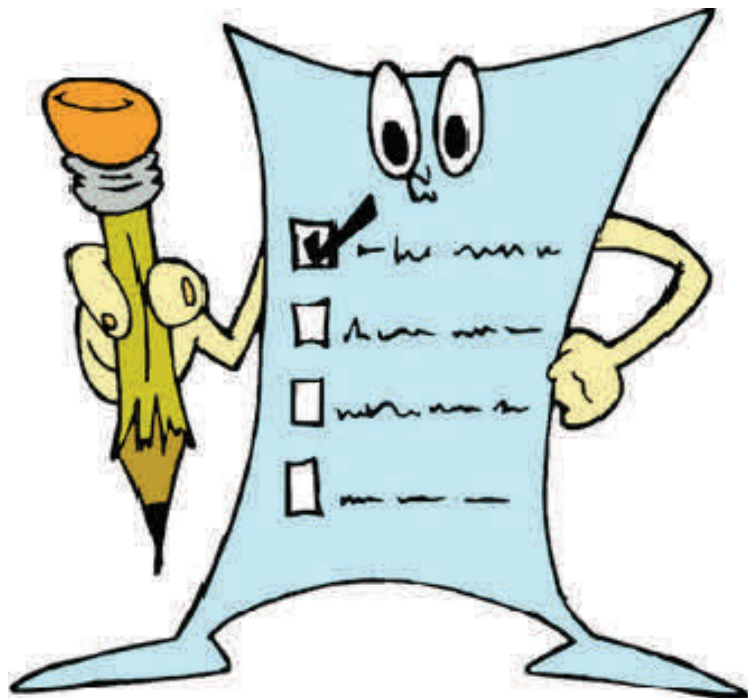
Stress Balls by D'ei
